## What is Lincus?

Lincus is a platform for UConn-affiliated faculty, staff, and students to learn more about interdisciplinary research occurring across all campuses. 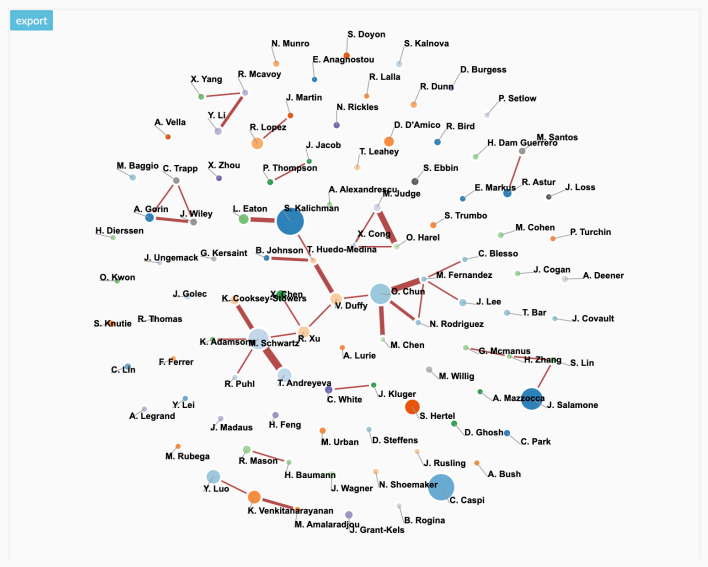
## Keyword Searches

1. Use key words identified during your brainstorming process to search through research publications across all departments and campuses.



## Understanding the Bubble

1. The searched keyword generates a faculty bubble of professors who have published papers with that term.
2. The larger the circle, the more papers the software has detected with that keyword.
3. Lines between professors indicate collaborations between laboratories.
4. The thicker the line, the stronger the collaboration, meaning the software has found more than one paper with both those professors and the keyword.



## Filters

When you initially generate the faculty bubble, you will see professors from all campuses. We recommend you start broad with no filters however located on the lefthand corner you can filter by campus, school, and department.
